ESRI's 27th Users Conference

GISCorps will be at ESRI's 27th User Conference (San Diego, June 18-22, 2007) and involved in a number of activities there.

- This year GISCorps' booth will be located at Ballroom 20 Foyer (to the west of the Sails Pavilion). Please come and join us on Monday June 18th during the Map Gallery hours from 4:30 to 8:30 pm.
- This year three presentations will be given by GISCorps volunteers. All presentations are held in one session and on Wednesday June 20th at 5:30 to 7:00 pm in room 28-A:
 - Chen Li will share his recent on-site volunteer experience with UNDP/AIMS in Kabul, Afghanistan.
 - Lori Quinn will talk about her remote mission with UNHCR in Egypt.
 - At last year's User Conference, and impressed by "My Wonderful World" activities, Beni Patel, one of our deployed volunteers, asked if GISCorps volunteers could also share their knowledge with their own communities and more specifically in the K-12 area. The idea especially made sense since GISCorps has never had as many projects as it's had volunteers (we have over 1,100 volunteers now). Following the conference, she formed a subcommittee and since then they have been looking into making this idea a reality. Two of the subcommittee members Leeanne Pacatte, and Laura Horton will be speaking about this new effort at this session. This is just one established effort in which GISCorps members could make a significant contribution. There are numerous formats and methods that can work. The committee is organizing and planning now and already see a need for volunteers to help form partnerships with similar organizations, to develop teaching materials and curricula, to coordinate volunteers and, of course, to go into classrooms and communities. There are many possibilities for how each of us can contribute. Please join us to explore these
