• COVID-19 Response

- Jeff Baranyi of Esri has proposed a couple of project ideas for using our volunteers to develop data layers related to school closings by district, COVID-19 testing site locations, and possibly more. Discussed using an "adopt a geography" model where volunteers would be responsible for updating and monitoring the data for their area.

- Marketing activities: Allen; document is <u>posted here</u>.
 - Update for digital marketing package implementation:
 - New testimonials and sponsor logos finalized for the website. There is a
 donation form that will also need to be updated to include the new
 sponsorship levels/amounts (not certain this has happened yet and if we
 need to discuss). Other than that, believe we have everything we need to
 launch the digital sponsor package when Holly says we are ready to go.

Update to strategic plan: Dianne

- The URISA Coordinating Committee met in early March. The URISA Strategic Plan was presented/discussed; it is much more streamlined than previous plans and it has been posted to the URISA website. Kanban Board will be retired April 15. All committees have been asked to use Podio, and at a minimum use the Meetings and Documents Apps. I have had Wendy re-initiate the GISCorps Podio workspace and she has made me the administrator for the time being. I will work to update the space as minimally as possible.
 - Carol says Podio can link to Google docs and folders and permissions
 can be granted to potential users. I have connected with Carol and
 received the link with instructions on how to do this, but I have yet to try
 anything yet. This will be a learning experience as I am not terribly
 Podio-literate.

- GSuite migration Carol
 - No updates except that Wendy forward our request for information about applying for an IRS Group Exemption to the URISA legal team. The responded asking for additional information, which Wendy has supplied. Awaiting a determination of the feasibility of this approach before taking further action.
- Volunteer DB replacement Holly
 - I've been revisiting the Participants Database plugin to see if it could be used as a stopgap from now until we are able to migrate to Hub. This would save us money since we wouldn't have to pay for hosting and maintenance. Forms can be viewed now on the Sandbox site; still working on importing a subset of our existing VoIDB as a test. Would need to pay for two plug-in addons to allow users to login with passwords to update their records to to allow us to email selected sets of volunteers. The cost of these two add-ons is \$40.

URISA update - Bryan

- In the URISA policy manual, the Core Committee is described as a committee of 3-7 members having URISA membership. The URISA governing documents take precedence over the GISCorps policy manual, the modified version with membership requirements removed is incongruent with the Policy Manual.
- o In the Core Docs, there is really no mention of what a program of URISA is. Bryan will reach out to Dianne and the Core Docs committee to resolve that.
 - In the last 3-5 years there was a major overhaul of the Core Docs so it could have been dropped inadvertently at that time.
 - Bryan (URISA Board Secretary and Core Cocs committee chair) requests assistance in drafting a definition of URISA program, especially in context of GISCorps. This will be submitted to Core Docs committee for review and then to the board for adoption into the Policy Manual.
